PUBLIC MASSES: From this Monday, May 10th - It will be possible to have congregations at our weekday and weekend Masses. There is a limit of 50 people in each church with the exception of very large churches where a number of pods of people not exceed 50 can be created as long as they remain separate from each other. The precautions that were established between June and December last year will still be in place and Mass goers are requested to co-operate with whatever procedure is in place in your parish. People may also attend Mass by sitting in cars outside churches where this is feasible and received Holy Communion in their cars.
